Welcome to *In Touch* – the magazine of Cheltenham United Reformed Church.

**Cheltenham United Reformed Church** is a joint Pastorate of the 3 United Reformed Churches in Cheltenham. This means that they share a Minister – Revd Maz Allen – and indeed they work very closely together in all respects. New readers, who may also be new to the area, can be assured of a warm welcome at all 3 Churches:-

**St Andrew's United Reformed Church** is situated in Cheltenham town centre. It is a former Presbyterian Church built in 1885. Recent renovations have retained its essential character whilst at the same time delivering an impressive facility meeting the needs of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Current membership is around the 100 mark.

**Prestbury United Reformed Church** serves the village of Prestbury to the north of Cheltenham. It is a former Congregational Chapel built in 1866. Current membership is around the 20 mark. Services are normally held at Prestbury on only the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays of each month.

The Church in Warden Hill is a Local Ecumenical Partnership (LEP) between the Anglican and URC communities serving the large residential districts of Hatherley and Warden Hill to the south of Cheltenham. Sunday morning services currently alternate between St Christopher's and the URC Centre with a typical congregation of 85. Ministry is shared between the URC Minister (Revd Maz Allen) and members of the Anglican South Cheltenham Team Ministry of whom the Revd Jacqui Hyde has particular responsibility for The Church in Warden Hill. The Church in Warden Hill has its own church magazine – *The Lantern* – but its activities and events are also publicised in this *In Touch* magazine.

As I am too late to write an article this month, allow me to use this page to say THANK YOU to all of you who supported Kenya Projects (UK) in our fundraising over the last two years.



With your help, we raised £26,000 (thirty three million, eight hundred



thousand Kenyan shillings!)

We paid for the installation of the borehole at Gatondo Health Clinic plus handing over money for an extra storage tank, which should be in place by March. We bought 90 pairs of school shoes, gave money for repairs to St. Stephen's Children's

Home, bought a sack of rice for Jomo Kenyatta Home for Disabled Children, as well as paint, buckets etc. for the Clinic. We painted four consultation rooms and the laboratory.

As soon as the Bishop had dedicated the borehole the water was turned on and baptised the parched earth for the very first time. What a special moment! St. Stephen's children rushed to drink from the pipe and the Bishop and I were given more sophisticated glasses to taste the clean, fresh water. The borehole will undoubtedly transform the lives of the local community.

## Training for Learning and Serving TLS Lite

### **St Andrew's News:**

## St Andrew's February Charity - Street Pastors



At 9.30pm every Friday and Saturday evening a group of dedicated volunteers gathers at the Salvation Army Citadel in Cheltenham for prayer and preparation before going out onto the streets until 4.00am next morning. They are the Street Pastors, currently a 54-strong group drawn from 30 different churches in and around

Cheltenham. They work in teams of 6, with at any one time 4 out on patrol and 2 back-up and resting at base. They have been operating now for three years and have become a well known and appreciated part of the town's night life. Their duties are to mediate not preach, to comfort not reproach, above all to help not judge. Until about midnight they work as a team of four, but after that some areas quieten down, Montpellier for example, so they concentrate more on the town centre, working in pairs, although keeping within sight of each other should mutual help be needed. Anyone can call on their assistance and their distinctive uniforms make them easy to pick out. Each team has a trained first-aider and they have radio or mobile phone contact with base, the police and ambulance services and some of the staff in bars and clubs. So what sort of situations are they likely to be involved in? Disturbances of one sort or another are often better resolved by a small group of recognisable and even-tempered people than by the police, whose presence might actually make matters worse and the police do call up the pastors on such occasions: people worse for wear due to alcohol, drugs or dehydration are found taxis, given water, reunited with friends, or even escorted home if they live in the town centre: early morning hours can be very cold for people in flimsy party clothes so lightweight temporary foil blankets are handed out: flip-flops are given to ladies who have been dancing in high heels and finding it painful to walk:

broken glass here, a patch of vomit there, discarded bottles and cans over there are cleared up to minimise hazards for the unwary or possible weapons for the belligerent: there's a chance to meet the homeless, who welcome a chat and a hot drink: and all the time be prepared to chat to people, answer questions, make them feel safe, make them feel comfortable.

With the numbers they have at the moment the Street Pastors are rostered for one night's duty approximately once a month, although festivals, race meetings, New Year and similar special occasions call for extra watches, so more volunteers would be very welcome. And it all runs on donations, all of which are used for the sort of activities described above, helping revellers enjoy Cheltenham's night life safely and satisfyingly.

#### Cinderella and the C4 Choir

Just when you think they'll never keep up that standard they prove you wrong. Yes, the C4 choir have done it again! They go from strength to strength, both in numbers and in quality. Their December production, "Cinderella and Rockerfella", was a thoroughly entertaining sell-out success. This was a bigger undertaking for them than previous shows, especially for the principals, who had learnt their words and moves really well, quite an accomplishment in a two part musical play lasting over an hour. This was a play, a musical and a pantomime, with many of the traditions of all three - an obviously wicked witch, some obviously good fairies, some excellent solo and duet singing, direct addresses to the audience and a couple of cheer leaders with hurrah and hiss placards (it turns out that "HISS" looks just as suggestive upside-down as the right way up!). As always the singing was great fun, with catchy tunes and clever lyrics clearly sung, including a swingalong version of Strauss's "Blue Danube" waltz with new words in the all-important shoe fitting scene. And all of it beautifully backed up by the augmented adult choir. "Cinderella and Rockerfella" is basically the familiar Cinderella pantomime story with one or two intruders: was that walking talking mirror a fugitive from Snow White? Did that clever and remarkable cat stray in from "Puss in Boots" or "Dick Whittington"? This was a big challenge for everyone involved and they pulled it off in great style.

So it's a big thank you and congratulations to all of the C4 Choir for cheering us all up on a dismal December day with such a heart-warming performance. All the learning and the rehearsals were worth it and the result was great fun for all. But let us not forget the backstage team and the folk who provided the props and costumes. ## New Gift Aid rules and forms – Part II For those who give to St Andrew's under the Gift Aid scheme!

Firstly, our thanks to everyone who has already completed and returned signed copies of the new Gift Aid forms – it is much appreciated. Thanks also to those who have advised us that their circumstances have changed and that they no longer pay sufficient tax to cover their donations.

In case anyone feels unsure as to whether they qualify to use the Gift Aid scheme, the basic rule is that for every £1 tax you pay, you can use the Gift Aid scheme to 'cover' £4 of donations. For example, if you pay, say, £400 tax a year, that covers donations of 4 times that amount, i.e. £1,600 a year; similarly £100 tax covers £400 of donations and £1,000 tax covers £4,000 of donations, etc.

To save stationery, postage and administration we sent the new forms out by a number of methods – by e-mail, with In Touch and by post. If for any reason you make donations to St Andrew's (particularly by standing order) and did not receive a form, please let David Black or Anne know.

If you did receive one but your circumstances have changed so that, having read the above examples, you are not able to sign a new declaration, it would be helpful if you could let one of us know (contact details below), so that we can cancel your previous declaration. Any discussions on the subject will, of course, be entirely confidential.


